Elijah's Restoration (I Kings 19)

This chapter begins with Elijah's feelings of fear, discouragement, disillusionment, hopelessness and despair. In this context God speaks to Elijah.

(1) Elijah, be quiet.

- God told Elijah to stand in the mountain and wait for Him to pass by. There comes a storm that breaks the mountains into pieces. Then an earthquake, and a fire. But God was not in any of these dramatic events. Finally there comes a gentle whisper and Elijah hears God speaking to him.
- We cannot run away from the storms in life. But if we have not remained quiet in the presence of God to hear the gentle whisper, we will have nothing to say to the storm, earthquake and the fires of life.
- In the quiet state we hear the voice of reason and understanding. God's primary way of leading and speaking to us is through our reason and understanding that is refined through God's Word. (Psalm 32:8-9)
- Many people have seen a demonstration of God's power, and through that become convinced that God exists. But it is quite another thing to be quiet and hear the voice of God whispering to us. A voice is personal, but a gentle whisper is intimacy.
- Good Friday was a storm, earthquake and fire. But in the quietness of that Easter morning, God whispered to the world saying, "He is risen. There is hope!" This voice is what we need to hear.

(2) Elijah examine yourself.

- God asked Elijah the same question ("Elijah what are you doing here?") twice and got the exact same reply both times. This is his answer to God paraphrased, "I am having a self-pity moment and enjoying it. Look how hard I am working for you, and how badly I am being treated. I am the only one faithful to you."
- What controls your story? How would your story start? Does it start with the words, "I am a sinner saved by grace. I received forgiveness, therefore I give forgiveness."

(3) Elijah, do the right thing.

- Elijah is asked to anoint Hazael king of Aram, Jehu king of Israel and Elisha who is to be his successor. But there is no record of Elijah actually doing this later on.
- God was telling Elijah to affirm, partner with, and bless others. Hazael, Jehu and Elisha are significant because they will go on to finish what Elijah started, i.e., the full purging of Israel from Baal worship.
- Make way and mentor those who come after you. God buries his workers, but never buries his work.
- Do the right thing. Be wise in appointing your leaders.

(4) Elijah, you are not alone.

- There are 7000 faithful people who have not bowed the knee to Baal. Go, seek out their company. Encourage them, and be encouraged. Together you will finish the work of the Lord.
- Elijah was a man just like us. If he needed to receive these words of encouragement and affirmation from God, how much more we! Pastor Kedo Peseyie
