NEBUCHADNEZZAR'S DREAM (Daniel 2)

(I) A DREAM THAT DISTURBS. Nebuchadnezzar had a dream that greatly disturbed him. He lost his sleep because he sensed that his kingdom was about to be taken from him. He was deeply shaken because without his kingdom he is finished. (Contrast this with the New Testament attitude: *To be alive is a blessing. To die is to win it all!*)

God put a dream in the subconscious mind of Nebuchadnezzar. (The Psalmist says, "You created my innermost being"). He commands his sorcerers to tell him the dream and the interpretation or face death. He is doing this to test if their god is real or fake.

It's easy to talk religion, and continue being religious. But only the truth will save us. *How much of our Christian life and church life is just religiosity? And how much of our church life is based on pure biblical truth?*

(II) A PRAYER THAT REVEALS. When Daniel heard about the order to kill all the wisemen in Babylon, he requested the king for more time. He organised a prayer meeting with his friends and they begged for God's mercy. Daniel found that God's mercy is double-edged: (1) the revelation of mystery, and (2) the deliverance from death.

Daniels' prayer after receiving mercy is very specific. We often say very general praise to God. But the Psalms are personal and the praise offer is usually very specific and experiential.

When was the last time God did something for you for which you can praise and thank him specifically? (Not just in a general way like "God I thank you because you are the creator") This is a test for true spiritual conversion and true biblical spirituality.

The dream interpreted: #Head of Gold=Babylon. #Chest of silver=Persian. #Middle and thighs of bronze=Greece, Alexander the great. #Legs of iron, feet of iron and clay=Rome. #Stone=Jesus and the Kingdom.

It is surprising that Nebuchadnezzar received Daniel's interpretation with delight even when the interpretation was not favourable to him. The days of his kingdom are numbered. He will be conquered by a kingdom inferior to his own, ultimately to be crushed into pieces by a small stone. Why was he strangely relieved? Here, I think, is there answer: *When God speaks, it may not be the answer you want, but GOD himself is the answer you seek. It strangely silences you and satisfies you*.

At the end of Chapter 2, Nebuchadnezzar is impressed, but not converted yet. One can be impressed with Christianity and church, but conversion is a different thing. We will not enter the Kingdom of God by being merely impressed with His Son.

(III) THE DREAM THAT RESTORES. At the end of chapter 2 Daniel presents a dream, still unfulfilled in his day. The "stone uncut by human hand" which appeared during the Roman rule is Christ and it represents how he came to establish the Kingdom of God on earth.

For us today, this Kingdom is a reality because of Christ, but not fully realised yet (Kingdom already/not yet). Daniel looked ahead and saw a great mountain. But actually it is two mountains – the *first coming of Jesus* where he inaugurated the Kingdom, and the *second coming of Jesus* where he will come to established his Kingdom on earth. We live in the valley between the two mountains, and we must constantly learn to look up.

The gospel is not only backward looking. The early saints at the end of their lives were not looking backward. They were looking forward to the Kingdom that will never be shaken; the Kingdom that will have no end; the Kingdom we will one day call home!
