Last Sunday message

THE DAILY MIRROR

James says (in v.18) that God gave us birth through the word of truth which God implanted within us. We know we are born again, not by the amount of good works we do, but by the seed that is implanted within us.

How do we know we have this seed implanted within us? We will know when we have:- (1) conflict of holiness. We are grieved when we do wrong. (2) We have a hunger for God deep within. (3) We have a desire to be more like Jesus.

When we are born again God puts a new heart, a new spirit and the Holy Spirit of God within us (Ezekiel 36:26-27). Those who are in Christ are a *new creation* (2 Corinthian 5:17). If we want to see what this new heart/spirit and new creation looks like, we should look into God's Word—the mirror—where we will see ourselves as God sees us; renewed, forgiven, transformed and empowered by His Spirit.

There are three (two positive and one negative) things this mirror can cause:-

(1) <u>Self Realization</u>. The Bible is often compared to a mirror (v.23). You can trust this mirror to give you a perfect picture of your born again spirit in Christ. Here you will see yourself as God sees you- transformed, restored, forgiven and empowered. Looking intently into this mirror will build spiritual confidence.

This mirror will also give you a perfect picture of God's love, power and what He can do for you. Everyone has a theology, whether good or bad, because everyone has his or her own ideas about God. Even an atheist. Our theology needs to be shaped by the Bible, and not by our experiences, not by the world, or not by short clips from social media platforms. (2) Self Deception. There are two ways in which believers deceive themselves.

First, we can deceive ourselves by being mere listeners and not doers (v.22). There is a thrill we get out of discovering new truth, and there is the thrill of public worship, but what is the use if we forget to practice what we learn and live what we know. The Devil will deceive us into thinking that we are spiritually doing well as long as we are reading our Bible and coming to church. But James says we are deceiving ourselves if we are not practicing it and living by what we know.

Secondly, we deceive ourselves if we don't control our tongue (v.26). The tongue burns with the fire of Hell. But the tongue, properly used, can also bring the power of Heaven. *The sign of spiritual maturity is the proper use and control of the tongue*. A spiritually matured person will not say things that will harm and pull down other believers.

(3) <u>Self Improvement</u>. V.25, says that the person who studies the word of God, remembers the Word, and practices it will be successful in all he does. This is ultimate self-improvement. Meditating on and obedience to the Word of God always bring success and prosperity (James 1:25, Psalm 1, Joshua 1:8).

James concludes the first chapter by giving three tests to gauge the quality of our spiritual lives: (1) Speech. Do we use our tongues to edify and strengthen others, or do we use it to stay in control of others? (2) Service. Are we able to give time to serve others, God and the church, or are we busy only with personal needs and personal prosperity? (3) Separation. How is your worldly pollution level? Are you keeping yourself from being polluted by the world?
