THE INCARNATION

"The Son of God became a man to enable men to become sons of God". - CS Lewis. "...the Word became flesh" (John 1). "...though he was God he did not consider equality with God as something to be grasped." (Philippians 2).

Genealogies in the Bible are important because, among others, it shows us two things:

- (1) *That we are created*. That all of us trace our stories back to Adam and Eve, who were created out of the dust of the earth (Genesis 1).
- (2) *That we are connected*. Every human being is deeply connected in ways which we will not fully understand. Every man was part of his mother once, and the mother was part of her parents once, and on and on backwards it goes until Adam and Eve.

The Incarnation clearly says that:

- (1) *Jesus Christ was not created*, not on Christmas. He is the Son of God from eternity. He existed before creation and was coeternal with God the Father. Jesus claimed, "Before Abraham was, I am". Jesus is before all things; *above all things; the end of all things; the alpha and the omega*. Jesus is the third person of the Trinity coeternal with God.
- (2) *He was not connected to us in the flesh,* in the way humans are. But he chose to come in human flesh, so that he can be connected to us, as we are connected in the flesh. In order to save us from our sins, he needed to make that connection.

What we can take away from the Incarnation of Jesus:

- (1) The Perfect man has come in the flesh. The message of the incarnation is that Christ the Perfect man has come. He had lived the perfect life God expected his people to live. He had attained perfection which God demands. He had reached the level of holiness expected of us. He had offered the sacrifice we were meant to offer. Humanity's vision is perfection. In a very important sense, in this Man Jesus, the whole of humanity had arrived, perfected and accepted. Because of Jesus we are perfected.
- (2) The person that Jesus was, and the work that he did, he did it in the flesh, as a man, and not necessarily as a God. This means that we can be all that he was when he walked in this world. (John 14:12-14). He affirmed our fleshly existence as good and meaningful. He affirmed the world we live in as good and worth saving, in fact worth dying for.
- (3) He died and offered the perfect sacrifice. He died as a man. All flesh must die, but because of Jesus, all flesh will be raised again.
- (4) When Jesus was raised, it was not just the Son of God who was raised. It was not just the divinity part of him that was raised. The human in him was also raised. This is our ultimate hope. God redeems us totally.
