James 1:12

James, the writer of the epistle, is the half brother of Jesus Christ, and was the Bishop of Jerusalem. He is known in history as James the Just, and was stoned to death for his faith. He writes through his experience, encouraging us to "count it all joy" when we go through all kinds of suffering, because they help build our character.

The reality of temptation: We are never free from temptation. We face them everywhere and every time. Being tempted is not the same as sinning, but giving in to temptation is a sin. This sin will lead to the destruction of our faith and forfeiting of our reward in heaven.

Most of the temptations we face come from within us. The body is always crying out to fulfil its needs; the soul is encouraging us to do the good; and the mind sits in between to take decisions.

When are we most vulnerable to temptation? When does it come? Do we have the faith to recognise temptation and fight them?

- (1) Temptations often come during [or after] our mountain-top experiences. These are usually significant moments in our life, like times of great success, when we are born again, powerful ministry experiences, etc. This can happen to individuals as well as to churches. We have programs, but do we have power? Do we even believe in the power of God to transform and change?
- (2) Temptations come when we are physically weak. When we are in need, we are tempted more often. But James says that when we endure temptations, we will secure the "blessed position" for ourselves. The "blessed position" is the place where we enjoy the pleasure of God.
- (3) When we are alone, we are tempted the most. The question that defines our Christian character is this: Who are you when nobody is watching?

How do we resist temptation? (I) Prayer. (2) Reading the Bible.

The Reward: Everybody suffers. But is our suffering for the glory of Christ? Are we suffering for the sake of righteousness and for the sake of the truth? Is yes, then this suffering is worth enduring because in the end God will reward us greatly. This is difficult, but possible.

Our faith is under attack. James is encouraging us to endure so that we may receive the crown of life. The blessed position that James talks about is earned through enduring at all times. Everyone who believes in Jesus will be saved and go to heaven. But the crown of life is for those who endure and overcome trials and temptations in life.
