The Christmas Love Story

In 1962, Karl Barth, considered one of the greatest theologians of the last century, was giving a series lecture at a Seminary in the US. After the series, the President of the Seminary asked Barth to share his greatest theological insight he had throughout his career as a theologian. Barth simply replied, "Jesus loves me this I know, for the Bible tells me so."

The Christmas story is a love story. It has all the elements of a good love story: the pursuit, the risk, the tension, the meeting point. Jesus came in pursuit of his people, took the risk of incarnation, and created a meeting point between God and men in a lowly manger ultimately leading to the Cross. This is the story that the world needs to hear. Unfortunately the world has a different ear and hears only the negatives, the duty, the rules, etc. They hear only prohibition, clean election, politics, hatred, etc. This Christmas, let us get the story right again.

Like Barth, Jesus was also asked a similar question in the Temple once. What is the most important command of all? What is the greatest theological insight? Jesus replied, "Hear O Israel, the Lord our God the Lord is one. Love the Lord your God.... and love your neighbour?"

Yes, Love. That is important. But Jesus knows that we cannot love God or love our neighbour on our own. Therefore before he mentions the commands, he reminds them to *hear, listen and receive* who God is and what He has done. Historically, the Covenant of grace and love came before the Law was given. And now God has empowered us with his Spirit and given us new hearts (Ezekiel 36) to enable us to love him back and love others. John says that it is not we who loved God, but God who first loved us.

Therefore, there is nothing greater and more important than to sit down, listen, understand and receive what God has for us in his Word. This is the secret to receive great empowering from God. Do this, and you will find the power to love God and neighbour well.

What do we learn about God's love from the Christmas story?

- (1) This Love is Powerful. This love is powerful because this love is unconditional and unreasonable.
- (2) God's Love is equal, but the fact is that the lowly, the simple and the poor receive it much more willingly than the powerful, and therefore God's love sometimes appears biased toward the poor. Wise men still seek Christ. But Christ was already with the lowly, the poor and the underdogs. We cannot ignore this fact in Christmas, that God dwells more comfortably with the simple and the lowly than he does with the powerful and rich.
- (3) God is easily approachable and available. Even shepherds and simple streets folks were comfortable with Christ.
- (4) This is Love in action. The incarnation is love in action. This action was completed on the Cross. Imagine what it would be like to receive a great act of love done specifically for you? The Cross was an act of love done specifically for you.
- (5) God is offering a relationship. The starting point of any relationship is a meeting point. How do I begin a relationship with God? You meet him in His Son Jesus Christ.
