THE GREAT GOD

Deuteronomy 8

Deuteronomy is a series of sermons Moses preached to the people of Israel on the eve of their conquest of Canaan, the Promised Land. This was their generation's greatest task. What is God telling them through Moses? Two things: (1) You have a great God. (2) You have great dangers ahead. I imagine a father telling his son ahead of a very competitive sporting event: "Remember, win or lose, I love you. And be very careful".

(1) You have a Great God.

- God's love is great. (7:6-7) God chose Israel not because they were great, but because of His love. This is a covenanted love which will never fail or fade. God is saying to His people, "I love you because I love you."
- God's power to deliver and help them conquer is great. He brought them out of Egypt. He will help them conquer Canaan. And He did. The other issue is the conquest of land. How can they just walk in and seize land belonging to other people? Consider the following: (1) If God—after promising them a land flowing with milk and honey—gave them a jungle to inherit, that may not be very fair or great. (2) The Land anywhere and everywhere belongs to God anyway. (3) The inhabitants of Canaan were idol worshippers, and therefore enemies of God. The Israelites were supposed to go in and smash the idols and establish the worship of Yahweh.
- God's blessings and promises are great. The simple principle in the OT is this: <u>If you obey my law, I will bless and prosper you</u>. For every promise, there is always a condition. The Bible is not a burden dumped on us. The Bible is a support and a guide pointing us to the life of blessings. To get the blessings we need to fulfil the conditions. Israel never did enjoy these blessings for long because they keep forgetting to smash the idols in the land they conquered.
- God's demand is great. God demands obedience to the "whole" commandment, and to walk in the "whole" way revealed to us (vv1-2). God demands our all, not half-hearted devotion or service.

(2) You have great Dangers.

- God disciplines us to keep us away from dangers, because He loves us. If anyone is going through a period of discipline and suffering, be assured that you are in the hands of a loving God who is looking to "do you good in the end" (8:16).
- The greatest dangers are not from the outside of us. God can deal with them. The 900 chariots of iron of Sisera was not a problem for Deborah (Judges 4). Gideon faced the Midianites and the Amelikites whose armies were like locusts across the land with just 300 men (Judges 7). The walls of Jericho are not high enough for God to bring down.
- But their greatest dangers are within. That is why they needed repeated warning to take great care and be alert (8:11). The dangers of pride, forgetfulness, unfaithfulness, disobedience and greed have proven to be dangers that brought God's people down too easily too often.

Conclusion:

Remember what God has done and be grateful and humble. "What God has done in the past is a pattern for what God will do in the future. But He is too creative to do the same thing the same way twice". He will do it again, only in a bigger way. Knowing this truth enhances faith and helps us to look to the future with hope and confidence because our God is great.
