James 1:1-8 / 13-15

The Greek word "peireismous" is used in v.2 to mean trials, and in v.13 to mean temptations.

A FEW TRUTHS ABOUT TEMPTATION: (vv.13-15)

- (1) Temptations are not from God, but He allows them to give us an opportunity to grow stronger in victory and mature in faith. God can turn evil into good, and with God's help, we can use temptations to our advantage to grow toward perfection and maturity.
- (2) To be tempted is not the same as sinning. Jesus was tempted (Hebrews 4:15, 1 Corinthians 10:13), but He did not sin. When we are tempted, if we start condemning ourselves for even having such thoughts, we have already been defeated. But we need to acknowledge and recognize the temptations, so that we can cast it aside and block it from turning into sin.

WEAPONS AGAINST TRIALS: (vv. 2-8)

(1) Get More Joy, *v.2.*

To someone who is undergoing severe trials, these words "Count it pure joy..." can be offensive. But this is not joy arising out of our circumstances, but pure joy coming from God. This is pure joy undiluted by circumstances, human prejudices or expectations, or even tainted by sin. God gives His people such joy. "Joy, which is the cheap publicity of the pagan, is the gigantic secret of the Christian." -GK Chesterton. A sermon outline by Jonathan Edwards on Christian Happiness goes like this: A Christian can be truly happy because: (i) All the bad things will turn out for good. (ii) All the good things will last forever. (iii) The best things are yet to come.

(2) Get More Understanding, v.3.

For we *know* that the testing of our faith will make us "perfect, mature, lacking nothing". We can have this assurance only when we have attained a deeper level of understanding of God's character (that He never fails), His word (that His promises are true), that He is involved and interested in our situation.

Abraham's faith was not a blind leap of faith into the darkness. He had already encountered God long enough to *know* that when God says "go" or "do it", God can be trusted. We all need this deeper level of understanding that comes from the knowledge of God and His Word, and experience of His greatness and faithfulness. Abraham and James had both knowledge of God and experience of His greatness. Therefore they could say, "We count it all joy...while God is making us perfect, we will lack nothing".

(3) Get More Submission, v. 4.

Submission is not easy, but without our surrender and willing submission to God's good plan and will, God cannot do His good work in us. God works in three different ways: First He works *for* us to give us salvation; second, He works *in* us to bring about our sanctification; and then He works *through* us to bless others and bring people to Him. Without submission, we will miss God's plan and purpose for us.

(4) Get More Wisdom, v.5-8.

A lady who was undergoing severe trials in her life prayed, "Give me wisdom so that I will not waste my trials." This is the meaning of James 1. Without wisdom from God, we cannot trust Him fully, or even do and say the right thing. And when we pray for wisdom, God just gives it to use without finding fault. This is a prayer He will surely answer. But we should not be double-minded. A double minded man is always wavering between faith and doubt. He is not sure whether he hates sin and loves God; he is not sure whether he is ready to fully surrender to God's will. He has tasted the goodness of God, but still wants to enjoy sin for some more time. Such a man can be sure of only one thing, i.e., he will never receive anything from God.
