# **The Big Picture**

James 4:11-5:12

James 5:7-9 gives us the big framework under which we are to think, plan and live out our Christian lives. The big picture James wants us to see is this: - Jesus, the Law Giver and judge, is coming again to judge and restore all things. We can expand this broad framework a little further: (1) Jesus is coming back. (2) There is a Law Giver. Behind the law is not an impersonal stone, but a Law-Giver who will hold us accountable. (3) God sees the past, present, and the future. (4) Justice will one day be restored. The Judge is already standing at the door.

With this framework in mind, we look at the passage and find four different groups of people represented.

#### (1) The Tongue tweeters (4:11-12, 5:12).

- Criticisms and gossip kills three people: the speaker, the listener and the subject.
- When we backbite and criticise others, we are judging and questioning the authority of the Law, and rejecting the Law-Giver.

#### (2) The Businessman and his plans (4:13-17).

- God who sees the past, present and future, is the one and only reliable guide and protector.
- We are safe and secure, and we will prosper at the centre of His will.
- The great danger is to move away from His will and plans.

### (3) The Rich man and his greed (5:1-6).

- Three source of riches in that early society were: stored food, clothes and precious stones. James says food can decay, moths will eat up your clothes, and precious stones will corrode.
- God will renovate everything we know by fire. Nothing of temporal value will last.
- The NT warns against greed three times more than it warns against adultery. That's because adultery is obvious. No one commits adultery without knowing it was adultery. But greed and gossip can creep in unnoticed. This is dangerous.
- God takes note when poor people are exploited. The Judge is already standing at the door.
- Hoarding defeats the purpose of money because money is to be used as a tool, not to be stored up.
- We are to love God and use money, not the other way round.

## **(4) The Farmer and his patience** (5:7-11).

- A farmer's job is to plant, water, wait and persevere. A farmer who waits for something to grow up without planting is a fool.
- He perseveres against fierce weather conditions, animals and insects, to protect and nurture what has been planted.
- Likewise, our job is to plant the Word of God, good works of justice and righteousness, and wait patiently for it to grow and bloom into the New Creation.
