Deep down deep, they know that even with all the achievements, the knowledge, the unlimited creativity that are in the world today, we do not have the answers to our deepest longings and fears. We cannot save ourselves; we don't have the solution for the problems of the world. Looking at all the chaos in the world today, we realise that the world is not so wise after all.

(2) The Responses, v.23.

- Some stumble at the folly and weakness of the Cross. Jews wanted signs and wonders as proof of God's power, but Jesus came in weakness. If we are ashamed and offended by the weakness and folly of the Cross, we are perishing because we do not see the purpose of the Cross.
- Others laugh at the folly of the Cross. The Greeks sought after knowledge and great understanding, but a man dying on a Cross seemed foolishness. If you laugh at this folly and weakness, you are perishing because you do not understand the Cross.
- But there are those who believe and receive the power and the wisdom of God.
- **(3) The Evidence**, v.26. Who will prove that God's wisdom is truly wise, and that God's power is really powerful? It is those who believe and receive.

Pauls reminds the believers of the following facts:

- What they were, (not all of them were wise, powerful or of noble birth, v.26.)
- Why they were saved, v.27.
 - * Saved through the foolishness of the Cross, so that their lives will stand as a testimony that God's "foolishness" is wiser that man's wisdom, and that God's "weakness" is more powerful than men's power.
 - * This will require us to play the role of the fool sometimes in our witness through our speech and lifestyle.
- What they have, v.30. They have righteousness [of Christ], holiness [of God and the Holy Spirit] and redemption [hope of total restoration].

(4) How is this wisdom and power displayed in us?

Paul says the wisdom of God is seen in three things (v.30-31):

- Righteousness: living with the character and love of Christ.
- Holiness: right living before God. High ethical standards.
- Redemption: future glory, hope and restoration.

The early disciples turned the world upside-down through the foolishness of the message they preached; the foolishness of the lives and choices they made; and through the foolishness of the hope they had in the Second Coming of Jesus.

If all we care about is to maintain our pride and reputation, we will never know Christ the Power of God and the Wisdom of God.

Last Sunday message...

The Cross: the Power of God and the Wisdom of God

1 Corinthians 1:18-31.

"The world through its wisdom cannot know God. We are saved through the foolishness of the message that was preached".

Where can I find the wisdom and the power for restoration, forgiveness and salvation? Where can I find the power and wisdom to live? Paul points us to the Cross- the foolishness of the Gospel.

Is the Cross really wise? Is God really powerful? Paul looks at the *witnesses*, the *responses*, and the *evidence*.

(1) The Witnesses, v.20. Paul summons three witnesses: the wise men, the scribes, and the philosophers. They represent the leaders, the scholars and religious teachers, the thinkers and creative people. Can they save? Is the world better through their leadership? Can they offer forgiveness through their learning and creativity? Is there eternal joy and peace?

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
