Working out one's own Salvation Philippians 2:12-16

This exhortation is from Paul during his imprisonment at Rome addressed to the believers at Philippi. The church was founded by him, the first church in Europe. He loved them, have them always in this mind and heart (Philippians 1:7-8) He reminded them of Christ's humility and obedience as an example to be followed (Philippians 2:5-8).

He appreciated the church for their obedience from the beginning and encouraged them to "continue to work out" their "own salvation with fear and trembling (Philippians 2:12)." This means to,

- (a) Work or doing. The joy of salvation within is to live out expressing through good deeds, sincerity and by being. For himself He said, "for to me to live is Christ" (Philippians 1:21). He also mentioned to the Corinthians that he "worked harder than all the apostles (I Corinthian 15:9-10). A believer is required to work on to the finish and to perfection" (Philippians 2:14). "For it is God who works in you to will and to act according to his good purpose" (Philippians 2:18). The Holy Spirit in the life of each believer operates in accordance with the commitment and level of obedience.
- (b) Fear and trembling go together. There are various kinds of fear e.g. Fear of uncertainties, loneliness, authority, failures, death etc. But the fear of God banishes all kinds of fears but God. "Fear of the Lord is the beginning of wisdom (Proverb 1:7) i.e. to hate evil" (Proverb 8:13), to do what God wants us to do, love what he loves and hate what he hates and to live Christ like life.
 - It leads one to involve in the affairs of extension of the God's kingdom. The Church of Philippians partnered with Paul in gospel ministry from the start and continued to do so in giving, faith, grace, prayer and in suffering. The same is expected of us today.
 - The fear of the Lord leads to a life of holiness, joy and sanctified life in Christ, having forgiven of sin and made righteous through the blood of Christ. Paul, thus urged believers to conduct their lives "in a manner worthy of the gospel of Christ" (Philippians 1:27).
 - The fear of the Lord brings inexpressible joy as one enjoys God's presence within which is expressed outwardly as an overflowing. Paul urged the believers to rejoice in the Lord (Philippians 3:1) and he again said "rejoice in the Lord always". I will said it again Rejoice! (Philippians 4:4). This is true of every believer regardless of circumstances.
 - The fear of the Lord makes one to enjoy the awesomeness of God's presence and enable him/her to worship God and spend time in His presence. Paul and Silas were praying and singing at midnight under chain in the prison at Philippi. Their praises and worship resonated across heaven and prison door opened, chains fell off from the hands of the prisoners. There took transformation within the prison. Worship touches the heart of God and worshippers do experience the reality of God's presence.
 - The fear of God draws one ever closer to the Lord through faith, through prayers, regular meditation on the word of God.
- (c) The ultimate end result of working out one's salvation in fear and trembling is to find one-self pure, blameless, without fault shinning as stars in this dark world of ours.

Therefore, the redeemed children of God have this confidence that "he who begun a good work will carry it on to completion until the day of Christ Jesus" (Philippians 1:6).
