

PRAYER FOR PEOPLE

James 5:13-20.

Prayer for those who are happy and successful; and for those who are in trouble. (v.13)

- Because times of success and health can sometimes lead to wandering and drifting away from God.
- The one thing we cannot argue against is our own success.

Prayer for the Sick.(v.14-16)

- There are sicknesses which may have been caused by sin, and there are sicknesses that are not caused by sin.
- Confession of sin is an important personal spiritual discipline. But we should be wise about confessing our sins in public. God requires that we confess public sins publicly, but confession of sin should never go beyond the extent of sin.
- The “anointing of oil”. In the OT, and in the Early Church, oil was often used for medicinal purposes. James encourages the use of medicine to help people find healing.

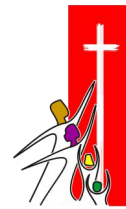
Prayer for the Nation.(v.17-18)

- Three words that introduce Elijah to us are: (1) He was *just like us*, (2) He prayed *earnestly*, and (3) He prayed *again*.
- His prayers shook a nation. Can our prayers shake a nation?
- The prayer of a “righteous man” is powerful. A “righteous man” in this passage is a man whose sins are confessed and forgiven, before God and men. He is guiltless. His conscience is clear.

Prayer for the Wanderer. (v.19-20)

- Notice how the words changes from “*wandering*” to “*sinner*” to “*death*”.
- It may start with a small sin or a minor drifting away from truth, but very soon it turns into a flown blown sin and bear the fruits of death. We need to be alert all the time.
- We need to pray for the wanderer. But not only pray, James says, if anyone reaches out to a wanderer, he saves him from death.
- Identify a person who may be wandering. Pray for him/her, and go reach out to that person.

PRAYER

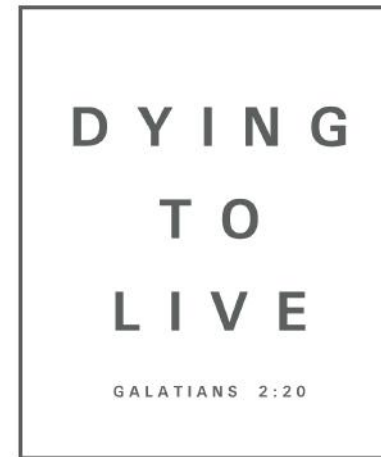
