EASTER SUNDAY

1 Corinthian 15:1-11

On an Easter Sunday morning, there may be different groups of people sitting in church. First group is saying, "I believe in the resurrection because it warms my heart." Sure. But what if something else warms your heart more? A good movie or a song could warm our hearts any day. If you are in this group, you may be a romantic, not a believer. The second group is saying, "I am not sure I believe in the resurrection, but I am part of this great church tradition. And Jesus' teachings help me be a better person." This sounds like the elder brother in the Prodigal Son, faithful to family tradition but missing the point; so near yet so far; always home but have never arrived. Here is a good traditionalist, but not a believer. The third group says, "I have verified the evidence of the resurrection. I have experienced its power in my life. And by this power I am working hard and moving forward." The person in the third group is definitely a Christian like Paul.

(1) THE EVIDENCE. Our text today presents us with several strong evidences. (a) The Evidence from Scripture. Jesus said several times that he would rise on the third day. (b) There were more than 500 eye witnesses who encountered the risen Christ. (c) The empty tomb itself may not mean a lot without the actual physical appearance of the risen Christ. (d) The greatest evidence of the resurrection is the testimony of the life that had been transformed by the power of the resurrection. Paul's transformed life is one such.

(2) THE POWER OF THE RESURRECTION AT WORK.

(a) One argument used against Jesus is that this "failed" Messiah promised to return with power before the present generation died. Jesus promised this in Mark 9:1, "...there are some standing here who will not die until they see the Kingdom of God (Son of Man) come with power..." Paul's answer is in Romans 1:3-4, "Jesus had already come with power in the resurrection." His Kingdom had already come in power, but many failed to see. (b) We need to be careful not to mix up the meanings of Pentecost and Resurrection. At Pentecost, the Holy Spirit was given only to the believers in Jerusalem, so that they may spread the Gospel throughout the world. But at the resurrection, something happened to the world. Total victory and power was won and had been declared to all the dark forces and systems of the world. This victory over the entire cosmos was so complete that Jesus could say, "...all authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me". (c) Lazarus was raised only to die again. Jesus was raised bodily and is moving forward to a new kind of life, never to die again. This resurrection power was manifested in physical and material realities. Here is a key point: "What God did for Jesus in the resurrection, God is doing for the believer, the church and the world today. Our world is moving forward to a new kind of reality never to fade or perish" -Romans 8. (e) Power for personal transformation. Millions of lives had been changed through this one historical event that had remained unchanged for 2000 years.

(III) SO WHAT? How should I live in the light of the resurrection of Jesus? Believe it. Receive it. Preach it. Stand firm in it. And work hard at it. "It is love that believes in the resurrection" (Ludwig Wittgenstein.) Love is the highest form of knowing. The resurrection is the most complete form of events. And to believe is the most complete form of surrender and submission.
