- (3) The six stone water jar for ceremonial cleansing, v.7. Continual filling and cleansing of the Holy Spirit. There is cleansing in v.6, then filling in v.7, and then there is a miracle in v.8. It does not happen this way all the time, but when we make a clean break from sin and seek the filling of the Spirit continuously, we will experience breakthroughs in our lives.
- **(4)** The Sensation of the New Birth and New Life, v.9. This is real. You can taste it, like the master of the feast *tasted* the new wine and was surprised that it was so good. This was the best wine anyone had ever tasted in the history of the universe. The new birth is a sensation that God brings within us.
- **(5)** The Best is yet to come, v.10. If we believe in Jesus, we have to believe that the best is yet to come. The servants in the weddings usually serve the best quality wine first and bring out the low quality ones at the end of the party. But what Jesus brings gets better as the end draws near, and it will get even better.
- (6) Jesus is preparing His Bride, the church, and we are all invited to the greatest wedding feast ever in the history of the universe, v.4. (Revelation 19:7-9). As Jesus attended the wedding at Cana, could it be that Jesus was thinking of His own wedding with His bride the church, which will be made possible only by His death on the Cross? Could this be the reason why He mentioned "my hour" to His mother? I think so. There is a great wedding coming, and we, the church, are His bride. Don't miss this greatest event in the history of the universe.

Conclusion: there is a wedding about to crash and end in disaster because the young couple did not plan properly to ensure enough supply of wine. "They have no more wine". Have you been in situations where you have experienced similar frustrations: no more money, no friends, no resources left? God specializes in entering into such situations, turns it around, and brings a miraculous breakthrough. How did that happen?

Firstly, Jesus was invited to the wedding. Invite God into your life, your family and your circumstances.

Secondly, "Do whatever He tells you". This is what Mary told the servants. Obey God. If he comes into your life like he went into the Temple turning things upsidedown, so be it. Let Him have His way. If He comes in a gentle whisper, don't fail to listen. Just do it.

Third, receive the cleansing and forgiveness of the Cross.

Fourth, be filled with the Spirit to the brim. Jesus asked the servants to fill the jars to the brim. Likewise be filled with the Spirit. The Holy Spirit is a controversial topic today. But everyone agrees that we need the baptism and continual filling of the Spirit. Be filled – that's the only thing that matters. I don't care how you get it.

Just get it!

Last Sunday message.....

What Jesus Brings (John 2:1-11)

The miracle at the wedding at Cana is a sign. All the miracles of Jesus are like sign-posts pointing to a greater reality and truth about God. We don't stop and admire signposts on the way. We can thank God for them, but we move one to the place to which the signpost is leading. When good things happen, or we experience a miracle, we tend to stay in the "miracle" for too long. If that happens we may miss the greater good that God plans to do in our lives next.

If this miracle is a sign, what is it pointing us to? Consider the following:

- (1) **The Cross**, v.4. Jesus says "my hour has not yet come". Whenever John uses "my hour" he is always referring to the Cross.
- (2) The giving of the Holy Spirit, v.6.

Water is a sign of the Holy Spirit that gives new birth.

Water is also a symbol of the Word that cleanses.

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
